Please Note:

- The cost per student for an overnight Camp \$59.00. This includes all programs, accommodation and all meals from afternoon tea day one to lunch day two. Students are required to bring their own morning tea and lunch on day one. (prices subject to change if necessary).
- Catering includes all purchases and food preparation for meals from afternoon tea on day 1. Your group will be required to place meals in the oven or on BBQ, serve and clean up afterwards.
- The camp includes two adults at no charge. Extra adults will be charged for catering.
- Accompanying teachers and parents will be required to assist in delivery of programs and control student behavior.
